

Gypsy Moth

The City of Findlay has a small infestation of Gypsy Moth, primarily on the east side of the City along CR 236. In previous years, the Ohio Department of Agriculture had sprayed this section for the Gypsy Moth. The ODA is no longer treating our City for Gypsy Moth.



Dutch Elm Disease

Each year, the City of Findlay continues to lose more elm trees to this disease. Any resident suspecting their Right-of-Way tree has Dutch Elm Disease, should contact the City Forester for a tree inspection.



Bagworm

The City Forester has noticed a large number of trees in the City of Findlay exhibiting bagworms. The problem is spread throughout the entire City and is noted to be particularly troublesome on the Arborvitae and Spruce trees as well as Honeylocust trees. The insect does not limit itself to those species and can be seen on just about every type of tree.



Emerald Ash Borer

The City of Findlay has not yet found any Emerald Ash Borers on any City owned Ash trees, however, the insect has infested trees within Hancock County and in the City of Findlay. Residents suspecting that their Right-of-Way tree may have the Emerald Ash Borer should contact the City Forester to request a tree inspection.
